Is there a clear route between the facility and an operational emergency department?		
Are there any damaged trees or power lines threatening the building or grounds that have not been cleared?		
Can any interior damage be secured from access?		
Have downed powerlines on or near the building been addressed by professionals?		
Has all flooding been addressed?		
Have any staff or patient injuries occurring on site been addressed and the hazard cleared?		
Is there clear internal and external access to the functioning main entrance?		
Is there clear internal and external access to functioning and marked emergency exits?		
Have all hazardous chemical spills been appropriately cleaned?		
Are the smoke and carbon monoxide detectors functioning?		
Do any exposed or damaged electrical wires or outlets pose a threat?		
Can any damaged gas appliances or pipes be safely secured?		
Has a complete facility walkaround – interior and exterior – been completed?		

Items marked NO in this section should be addressed as quickly as possible but may not prevent reopening. Follow all local laws and regulations regarding safe reopening.

 Do you have clean drinking water for staff and patients? 	
Are the toilets functional?	
 If no, can you get a port-a-potty or use a neighboring facility? 	
Have all interior tripping hazards – power cords, debris, etc – been cleared or	
clearly marked?	
Can any visible mold or water damage be secured?	
Can the facility be kept at a safe temperature using climate control, fans, or	
heaters?
